ERIKAANSCHUTZ QUALIFIES FOR THE 2005 U.S. WORLD OUTDOOR TARGET ARCHERY TEAM

Sixteen-year-old Erika Anschutz of Grand Island, Nebraska successfully competed in the U.S. World Outdoor Target Archery Team Trials event that was held at Disney's Wide World of Sports Complex in Orlando, Florida during May 12-15, and qualified to be a member of the 2005 U.S. World Outdoor Target Archery Team. As the youngest member of the elite U.S. Team, Erika will represent the U.S. in both individual and team competitions against other top archers from around the globe at the 43rd World Outdoor Target Archery Championship in Madrid, Spain during June 20-26, 2005.

The U.S. World Outdoor Target Archery Team is comprised of sixteen men and women archers from across the nation who are divided into four, four-person teams based on their gender and type of bow used (i.e., recurve or compound). Erika will be joined on the women's compound bow team by Jamie Van Natta (Toledo, OH), Mary Zorn (College Station, TX), and Christie Colin (Cape May, NJ). The U.S. Team is sanctioned by the National Archery Association (NAA) and will be led by a veteran coaching staff, experienced in international archery competition.

This is the fifth U.S. World Archery Team that Erika has qualified for since 2002. However, this is the first senior (adult) U.S. Archery Team that she has qualified to be a member of. The four previous world teams that she competed on for the U.S. were at the junior level (age 18 and under). During August 2002, she traveled with the U.S. Team to Nymburk, Czech Republic for the VII Junior World Outdoor Target Archery Championships and established a new world record score while winning the gold medal in the individual compound bow competition for cadet women (age 16 and under). Less than one year later, Erika was the youngest member of the U.S. Team that went to Nimes, France during March 2003 for the VII World Indoor Archery Championship. While in France, she competed in the junior women compound bow division and won her second and third world titles with first and second place finishes in the team and individual competitions, respectively. In July 2004, Erika accompanied the U.S. Team on its trip to Lilleshall, Great Britain for the VIII Junior World Outdoor Target Archery Championships where she laid claim to her fourth and fifth world titles with gold and bronze medals being won in each the team and individual competitions, respectively. More recently, in March 2005, she again was the youngest member of the U.S. Team that went to Aalborg, Denmark for the VIII World Indoor Archery Championship where she won a silver medal

in the individual competition for junior women shooting a compound bow.
